New Covenant School Statement of Services School Year 2019-2020

New Covenant School provides specific accommodations for students based on the needs of the identified exceptional needs student. Each student that is identified as an exceptional needs student has a medical diagnosis by a medical professional. A medical diagnosis may include but is not limited to High Functioning Autism, ADHD/ADD, Dyslexia, Specific Learning Disabilities, Processing Disorders, and Speech Delays. The student that is identified as an exceptional needs student may have a 504 in place. The 504 accommodations are identified, implemented, and monitored by the Learning and Behavioral Coordinator as needed. Accommodations include, but are not limited to, preferred seating, repeated directions, chunking assignments, and a copy of the teacher's notes. The accommodations are identified based on the needs of the student. We will honor a 504 or IEP from another institution as long as we are able to meet the student's needs.

A student that is identified as a possible exceptional needs student is first identified and observed by the classroom teacher. The teacher notifies the Learning and Behavioral Coordinator, at which time, further observations are completed. Based on the observations, the LBC may recommend further testing for the student and provide specific techniques that may assist the teacher in the classroom.

INDEPENDENT ACCOUNTANTS' REPORT ON APPLYING AGREED-UPON PROCEDURES

We have performed the procedures enumerated below, which were agreed to by the management of New Covenant School ("the School"), on its compliance with certain requirements of the SC Education Oversight Committee in its determination of the School's eligibility to participate in the Educational Credit for Exceptional Needs Children Program for the year ended June 30, 2019, in the areas addressed. The School's management is responsible for compliance with the requirements of the Educational Credit for Exceptional Needs Children Program. The sufficiency of these procedures is solely the responsibility of the specified parties in this report. Consequently, we make no representation regarding the sufficiency of the procedures described below either for the purpose for which this report has been requested or for any other purpose.

Specifically, for purposes of this report, we have performed the following procedures and noted the indicated findings:

- Ascertained that the School can document and verify that all grants received under the Educational Credit
 for Exceptional Needs Children Program were for eligible children who were enrolled and attended School.
 We did not determine eligibility regarding disability.
 - a. We obtained documentation to verify that grants received under the Educational Credit for Exceptional Needs Children Program were for eligible children enrolled to attend the School. We noted no findings as a result of our procedures.
- 2. Verified the total amount of each grant per child from Exceptional SC.
 - We compared the total of grants received for each child to the amount(s) disbursed from Exceptional SC. We noted no findings as a result of our procedures.
- 3. Verified that no grant exceeded \$11,000 during 2018-19 school year.
 - a. We obtained documentation to verify that no individual student's grant exceeded \$11,000 for the 2018-19 school year. We noted no findings as a result of our procedures.
- 4. If applicable, we verified that the School returned to Exceptional SC a prorated amount of a student's grant if a student withdrew from the School during the school year.
 - a. We verified that the School returned to Exceptional SC a prorated amount of a student's grant if a student withdrew from the School during the school year. We noted no findings as a result of our procedures.

- 5. Verified that the total amount of each grant was used for tuition which is defined as "the total amount of money charged for the cost of a qualifying student to attend an independent school including, but not limited to, fees for attending the school and school-related transportation."
 - a. We obtained documentation that each grant was used for tuition. We noted no findings as a result of our procedures.

Accordingly, we do not express such an opinion or conclusion. Had we performed additional procedures, other matters might have come to our attention that would have been reported to you.
